# An September Message from Pastor Frank



#### **Grace and Peace**

As I am writing, it is the middle of August, but the weather, especially early mornings feels like September. As I am writing some children are returning to school, while others are preparing to do so before you have read this article. As I am writing, the church is buzzing with the sounds of children and instruments as the World Groove Drum Camp is happening. We have had a full house this

week. Our hope and plan is to continue to offer this to the youth of our community. As I am writing, I am making final preparation for a camping retreat in the mountains of Colorado. The retreat lasts for five days. I have had a practice of attending one retreat a year to intentionally and intensively connect with soul and spirit. Following the retreat Kathy will join me in Denver for a week of vacation. We will return on August 29. Kathy will be back to work on Saturday August 31, and I will be in worship on Sunday September 1. By the time you are reading this we will have shifted from our summer rhythm to that of autumn. We will shift from the rhythm of renewal and recreation to that work.

September begins with our national holiday of Labor Day, and marks the shift to a work and education rhythm. Labor Day was established to honor work that is represented by various forms of organized labor within our nation. I think this gives us an opportunity to reflect on all forms of work and labor.

We will reflect on work and vocation on Sundays, September 1 and September 8. We will begin by considering work and labor. Are there forms of labor which are overlooked in our culture? Are there forms of labor which are not valued as much as others? What experience of work have you had in your life? What is or was your means of making a living? Martin Luther's explanation of seventh commandment (in the 10 Commandments), you shall not steal includes the following; We are to... help them (our neighbors) to improve and protect their property and income. We lift the dignity of all forms of work.

The ELCA designates the second Sunday in September as the God's Work Our Hands Sunday. We will be reflecting on what it means to do God's work with our hands in the world. Martin Luther referred to something he called the priesthood of all believers? What do you think of when you hear "priesthood of all believers? When you read. "God's work our hands" what kinds of work come to mind?" I wonder how many people think first of work within the church. Perhaps, God's work includes more than we imagine it does.

September will bring an increase in the harvest of this year's fruitfulness. Throughout this month we will be experience an increase of harvest both in domestic fields and gardens, and the wild ones. What is being harvested in your life both at the physical and spiritual levels? As you may gather the harvest of gardens and fruit trees, consider what you are gathering in the work of both Soul and Spirit. What has arisen from the depths of your inner life, out of the Soul? What has come to you from beyond, the movement of Spirit?



# **Meditative Walk**

Take a quiet twilight stroll in the forest.
Relax your mind;

Twilight is that liminal time that divides light from darkness; the seen from the unseen; the known from the unknown. Listen for the owls to speak. Join the birds as they settle for the night. Smell the dampness of the forest floor as it rises up to greet you.

#### Here is an update from Allison:

Goblet Cell Adenocarcinoma produces two types of cancer cells. One causes tumors, the other one creates a cancerous biofilm. Thankfully I only have two tumors, but the spread into my abdominal cavity is extensive, and is why it's classified as stage 4, even though it hasn't spread into my lungs. The cancer has spread into my peritoneum (secondary peritoneal carcinomatosis) and into my omentum. Thankfully, it has not reached my lymph nodes, but I am dealing with malignant ascites, which is a backup of lymphatic fluid in the abdominal cavity. As you can imagine, it's a bit painful.

Your Love, prayers, and support are very much appreciated, by myself, my son, and my mother.
